Historical View of Lexington Market

The answer: Washington Blvd was originally called Columbia Ave. The first church in Ridgely's Delight was called the Columbia Avenue Methodist Church, located at what is now called Ridgely's Commons at 657 Washington Blvd, Baltimore. Although built as a church, the building saw the most use as a neighborhood community center, before being abandoned and later turned into private residences.

A portion of our neighborhood was built on land that was part of Rachael Howard's Dowry. So, this month's trivia question is, "Who did Rachael Howard marry?"


