Parking Rules Update

The Baltimore City Parking Authority has certain restrictions for commercial vehicles. Please take note of the following regulations to avoid a citation.

- Commercial vehicles are not eligible for a residential parking sticker or guest pass.
- If a contractor with a commercial vehicle is working at your home, you must apply for a contractor's parking pass, which will be eligible for 30 days. Passes are available at the Parking Authority office at 200 W. Lombard St.

Talking Trash

If you're new to the neighborhood, or if you just don't know when to put out your trash, this is a reminder that Wednesday is the general trash collection day. Trash must be in a covered container. Put your trash in the alley after 6pm on the night before pick-up and take the can in after collection. Place all recycling materials (plastic and glass bottles and jars, paper and cans) in recycle bins, cardboard boxes, paper bags or a clearly marked container for collection on Friday mornings. 

Eligible are responsible worksites not for paying YouthWorks participants, but they must provide close supervision and mentoring throughout the program. Ridgely's Record FOG Alert: Fats, Oils & Grease Program

The City has launched a new campaign to make everyone aware of the problems caused when disposing of fats, oils and grease from food in the garbage disposal. These materials can stick to the walls of the pipe and eventually lead to blockage of the line and sewer back-ups, which can harm the environment. There is a better way to dispose of meat fats, cooking oil, food scraps, sauces, salad dressing, mayonnaise, lard, shortening and butter. Pour it into a covered container and store it in the refrigerator or freezer. When the container is full, throw it in the trash. In addition, to avoid back-ups of our aging sewer system, throw toilet tissue only in the toilet. For more tips, visit www.cleanwaterbaltimore.org.
