The July community meeting will be held on Wednesday, 5 July 2017 at 7 p.m., upstairs at Sliders, 504 Washington Blvd. You are welcome to attend if you live, own property, or a business in Ridgely's Delight.

Our guest speakers this month will be a representative from 311 who will explain what kind of calls they handle, give us an overview of the 311 app and tell us what happens after we submit a request. We will also have David Pruitt, from the Walter P. Carter Center on Pratt St., give us an overview of their practice, to include their outpatient psychiatric services and outpatient chemical dependency treatment. We will have the opportunity to ask questions after each presentation.

The RDA board meeting will immediately follow the community meeting.

Pigtown Pop-up Park

Imagine the intersection of Washington Boulevard and MLK as a vibrant, active plaza, where pedestrians, cyclists and motorists can catch a glimpse of Pigtown's potential. Pigtown Main Street envisions the intersection as a public space that welcomes everyone from the three surrounding neighborhoods and doesn't just serve as the first stop for drivers coming into Baltimore from 1395. They are raising funds to create a temporary pop-up park with cafe tables and chairs, benches, planters and umbrellas, a synthetic lawn and lawn games, and a variety of other assets to make this corner a usable space for our neighborhoods. This article continues our series that focuses on past and present businesses in our community. This month we are meeting with Jay and Jin, the new managers of the Ridgely's Mini Mart.

When was your Grand Opening and what are your hours going to be?

We had our Grand Opening on Thursday, 22 June 2017. We will be open Monday thru Thursday 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. On Friday and Saturday our hours are 10 a.m. to 11 p.m., unless the neighborhood would like us to open earlier.

We understand that you manage a restaurant in Columbia, MD and therefore are not new to the service industry. What experiences will you be bringing from that business to this one?

Our deli in Columbia, MD is actually our second successful business. About 20 years ago we owned a liquor store in South Baltimore. I like selecting and purchasing a nice variety of national and local craft brews, wines and hard liquor and selling them to my customers. My wife enjoys running the deli in Columbia where she serves deli sandwiches handmade with Boar's Head cheeses and deli meats. We intend to marry those two successful businesses here in Ridgely's.

We are excited to see that you completely remodeled the interior of the Mini Mart. What did you change? What other new features can we expect in our neighborhood store?

We upgraded the beer and wine coolers, installed new floors, shelving, a gourmet ice cream freezer and a new deli counter, plus we redesigned the checkout counter and computerized the checkout process. We are also changing the name from Ridgely's Mini Mart to Ridgely's Market, to reflect the newer, upscale atmosphere.

You do have an amazing selection of alcoholic beverages and ice cream. Will you be adding additional items?

We currently carry American and Korean food, Almond and Soy milk, juices, snacks, pre-made salads and packaged deli meats. We are getting more items in each day as we are added to our suppliers' schedules. After we pass the Baltimore City Health Department Inspection, scheduled for July, we can start serving items like those found at my wife's deli, including sandwiches and potato salad. Security Cameras in Historic Neighborhoods

Concerned with how your new security camera might impact our Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) requirements? Our Ridgely's Delight Architectural Review Committee (ARC) offers these great tips from CHAPS Historic Preservation Design Guidelines:

- Install security cameras in the least obtrusive location possible.
- Select camera models that are as small in scale as possible.
- Do not damage or remove historic materials or obscure historic features when installing security cameras. Attachments should be made through mortar joints rather than masonry.

Last month's trivia question was, "What was the original purpose for the building that is currently standing at 723-725 W. Pratt Street?" The answer: The building was constructed around 1916-1917, according to information in Baltimore City Directories and Sanborn Insurance Maps. It formerly housed Atlantic Carpet Cleaning and Storage Company. Before vacuum cleaners were invented, the firm took in carpets for cleaning and stored them over the summer. When the weather turned cooler, customers took back their carpets to keep the floors warm. After the invention of the vacuum, the building was sold and later used for furniture storage.

This month's trivia question is, "Who was Barney Farnham, the gentleman who the neighborhood honored by dedicating the Conway Park Rose Garden?"
