Parking Permit Renewal

Your residential parking permit and visitor's pass will expire on Friday, 30 June 2017. The iParg renewal system is open now for Ridgely's residents and will close on Friday, 9 June 2017. Visit our website at www.ridgelysdelight.org/parking for the iParq link. If you are having problems with the registration process or require detailed information on required documentation, contact the Parking Authority office at 443-573-2800. First time permits and passes must be picked up at the Parking Authority office, 200 W. Lombard Street, Suite B. The office is offering extended hours on Saturday, 17 June from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and Thursday, 29 June from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Before adhering the decal to your car, ensure your new permit matches your license plate by looking at the two punch outs in the alpha-numeric grid on the left side of the decal. The punch outs must match the first and last characters of your license plate. If not, you should go to the Parking Authority office for a new decal.

This article continues our new series that focuses on past and present businesses in our community. This month we are meeting with Sharina and Stacy Baker, the owners of Cheat Day Bar and Grill. Cheat Day Bar and Grill is in the building which formerly hosted Pigtown Tavern and Shakers.

My husband and I went to Cheat Day Bar and Grill to arrange our June Happy Hour and were welcomed by the new owners Sharina and Stacy Baker. Both Sharina and Stacy were extremely hospitable and talked about their intentions for our newest, neighborhood bar.

What is your goal for your new business?

Our goal is to become the neighborhood gathering spot. We are offering great food and drinks with a friendly wait staff. We hope to be the place where people host baby showers and bachelor parties, or just come to watch the Orioles play. We signed a 10-year lease and purchased the liquor license, so we are here to stay. We want to become an established part of this community.

What changes have you made since you purchased the business from Pigtown Tavern?

We have been expanding the kitchen so that we can offer delicious, home style meals every night of the week. We have mac and cheese, tacos, chicken wings, and ribeye steak. We have a full menu available until 8:30 p.m., then offer a late nite bar menu. We are also adapting our menu to fit local favorites like crab balls and Natty Boh. We have arranged for \$5 parking at the Dollar Store for folks who drive to our restaurant.

Are you planning additional changes?

We will offer sidewalk seating beginning next month. On Mondays, we will host Game Night where we invite neighbors to play cards, board games, Connect 4 and Chess, among others. We will start a Trivia Night series on Tuesdays and we have Sip and Paint scheduled for Friday nights as well.

Several of our neighbors have said your food is awesome. What are some of your specials?

We have the Stacy Burger, a nice, juicy Turkey Burger, which can be served with fries. We also have a signature "Cheat Day" drink but currently our most popular drink is the Strawberry Hennessey.

I may have made a doubtful expression, as Sharina went behind the bar and poured my husband and me each a small drink of the Strawberry Hennessey. Stacy said that he has experience running clubs, so he knows how to make a drink. I must say, the drink was amazing.

The 15th Tour dem Parks, Hon!

Tour dem Parks, an annual bike ride through Baltimore's parks and neighborhoods will be held Sunday, 11 June 2017. The ride highlights regional parks like Carroll, Patterson, Herring Run & Druid Hill, as well as some quietly tucked away gems. Participants choose from 4 routes: 5 miles (a great family ride completely contained within Druid Hill Park), 15 miles (on the newest section of the Jones Falls Trail), 25 miles (trails and some streets), or 35 miles (for the experienced riders). Rest stops are staffed by mechanics from local bike shops. Registration includes tickets to the afterride jazz barbecue. Summer Renovations

Additionally, since Ridgely's Delight is an historic district, work on the outside of your home requires Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) approval prior to beginning any renovation. BaltimoreLink

The Maryland Transit Authority (MTA) is launching a massive overhaul of the MTA bus network on 18 June 2017. BaltimoreLink promises to be a more efficient and reliable bus network, replacing Baltimore's current outdated and gridlocked routes. BaltimoreLink states that they will strengthen connections between MTA's bus and rail routes and align the network with existing and emerging job centers. New bus shelters, signage, and other amenities will be added to improve the rider experience. New bus signs will be unveiled on Sunday, 18 June 2017 which feature route destination, route frequency, and the stop ID number. Passengers can text the stop ID number to MTAMD for information on the next bus. MTA is also installing 11 Baltimore City Bike Share stations at MTA rail stations and creating commuter routes between Baltimore and Aberdeen Proving Ground, Annapolis/Kent Island and Columbia/Howard County. 
Neighborhood Trivia
