#### **Delightful Gems**

This article continues our new series that focuses on past and present businesses in our community. This month, in honor of Saint Patrick's Day, we are meeting with James Quigley, Owner of Quigley's Half Irish Pub.

Quigley's Half Irish Pub has been serving Irish and American fare in Ridgely's Delight for 10 years. What drew you to Ridgely's Delight?

Well, I have always wanted to run a bar. I knew, with a lot of work, this bar could be the right one. I literally rebuilt this bar from scratch, using old marble, bricks, stained glass, and wooden windows. It took me a little bit longer than I had planned, but it needed to be historically accurate and I wanted to make the inside of the bar a place that people will remember and want to come back to. I opened in March 2007 and have been serving Ridgely's Delight ever since.

You are our neighborhood's Irish pub. What special plans have you made for Saint Patrick's Day?

Of course, we are going to start the day with bag pipes! Our bag pipe player should be here around 6 a.m. to 7 a.m. I'm going to serve Penny Pints until 8 a.m., along with a nice Irish breakfast until about 11 a.m. I will close Emory Street, from Melvin Street up to Portland Street, at noon. I have a live band from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. and more drink specials like an Irish Crush, which is made with Irish whiskey instead of Vodka.

That sounds like fun. Do you have similar plans for Opening Day?

For Opening Day, I'm going to focus more on families. Baseball is for families. I am going to host a block party on Portland Street between Emory Street and Greene Street. I am going to have my big grill out and cook hamburgers, sausages, hot dogs, pit beef and pit turkey. We will have Maryland Craft Beers, fun activities for the kids and live music from noon until 3 p.m. Everyone will be going off to the game once the band ends. This is a day to spend with the Orioles and with family.

Quigley excused himself and went to help guests at the bar, so I asked the next question to one of Quigley's regular patrons.

The trivia nights on Wednesday evenings have become hugely popular within the neighborhood! What happens on trivia night that has everyone talking?

Bobby (Van Allen) runs a great trivia night! We meet our friends here every Wednesday. We have a friend that is good with sports, one loves history. We are not very good with pop culture as a team. But Bobby announces the topics on the website. So sometimes we study a little bit before we show up, if it's a topic we don't know well. The night starts with a music round while Bobby takes everyone's drink and food orders. Quigley usually has a food special, but I stick with the burgers. Quigley's burgers are really good. You can have a nice dinner, learn something, and not worry about having to drive home. It's a great evening!

#### **Baltimore's 62nd Saint Patrick's Day Parade**

Baltimore will host its 62<sup>nd</sup> Annual Saint Patrick's Day Parade on Sunday, 12 March 2017, rain or shine. The parade will kick off at 2 p.m. from the Washington Monument, proceed South on Charles Street and then East on Pratt Street to Market Place.

The parade will be preceded by the Shamrock 5K Race, which begins at 1:15 p.m. and primarily follows the parade route. The parade and 5K race draws tens of thousands of marchers, runners, and spectators to downtown each year.

#### **Opening Day Street Closures**

Opening Day will draw over 50,000 baseball fans to Camden Yards at Orioles Park and to our neighborhood. To ensure pedestrian safety and to support our neighborhood block parties, the following neighborhood streets will be closed beginning at 10 a.m. on Monday, 3 April 2017:

- Washington Blvd in front of Pickles and Sliders
- Portland Street between Emory Street and Greene Street
- Emory Street between Dover and Portland Streets

The Residential Parking Permit Program (RPP) will be strictly enforced. Please ensure your vehicle has a valid Area 5 parking permit if you, or your guests, intend to park on a neighborhood street on Opening Day.

#### **City Schools are Facing Funding Cuts**

Baltimore City schools are facing a budget deficit of around \$130 million for the upcoming school year, and a possible reduction of staff and teachers by as many as 1,000 employees. Our local network of schools is a vital part of the community for the families that live here in Ridgely's Delight. Further, this school network crosses many district boundaries in the city and serves as a method to help promote the balance of city services and opportunities across the spectrum of resident needs.

The families of Ridgely's Delight would appreciate the support of neighbors in addressing this budget deficit to our elected officials. It is too early to know how this budget shortfall will affect city schools, but families are advocating for adequate school funding because that is a direct path to long-term economic success for the city. We are all in this together!
