Parking Permit Renewal Registration

Your residential parking permit and visitor's pass **will expire on June 30**th. If you do not have a new permit or pass on your car as of July 1st, you will be subject to a ticket. Ridgely's residents can visit our website at <u>www.ridgelysdelight.org/parking</u> for the link to renew permits and passes toward the end of the month when the system is available. We will send an email when the link is posted, so be sure to join our email list at <u>www.ridgelysdelight.org</u> if you haven't already.

Permits and passes will be available for pick-up at the Parking Authority office in the latter part of June. The office will be open one week night and one Saturday during the renewal period. The dates will be published in next month's newsletter. There will also be a neighborhood pick-up on June 26th from 6-7:30pm at Sliders Bar and Grill. Note that you must pay for your permit online by 5pm. on June 24th if you want to participate in the neighborhood pick-up.

Moving Out?

As school closes for the summer, many students move out Ridgely's Delight, which means there's a lot of extra trash. Please note that if you leave large items such as furniture and appliances for weekly trash pick-up, you could be fined for illegal dumping. If you are a tenant who has moved out, and your landlord is fined, the amount can be deducted from your security deposit. Therefore, please make sure you properly dispose of your unwanted belongings.

Following are some resources for disposing of your large items:

- Call 311 for bulk trash removal of up to three items, which will be picked up on the first Tuesday of the month. Appointments fill up early, so schedule yours as soon as possible.
- Sell or give away items on Craigslist.
- Make a tax-deductible donation to Goodwill.
- Donate small appliances and household items, electronics and clothing to Purple Heart, which benefits U.S. veterans. To schedule a pick-up at your home, visit www.purpleheartpickup.org.



The Baltimore Farmers' Market & Bazaar has returned for its 37th season! It opens every Sunday underneath the Jones Falls Expressway at Holliday & Saratoga streets (April-Dec).

While strolling through Maryland's largest producers-only market, shoppers can revel at the sight of a vast quantity of foods, including crisp fruits and vegetables, poultry, seafood, beef, pork, lamb, bison, goat, rabbit, fresh baked goods, flavorful herbs and organically raised and produced milk, yogurt, butter, eggs and cheese products. Additionally, dozens of food vendors add spice to the market with multicultural cuisine such as popular pit beef sandwiches, omelets and breakfast burritos, crepes, wood fired pizzas, pies and quiches, soups, noodles and dumplings. Vegan items are sold as well. The bazaar offers shoppers a variety of unique crafts and collectibles including jewelry, handbags, hair accessories, clothing, rugs, pottery and wooden items, stained glass and photographs.



Dog Hikes with the Doctor at Baltimore Humane Society

Bring your dog the First Sunday of each month at 11am through November! Hike on the grounds of the animal shelter's forested wildlife sanctuary in Reisterstown, led by Dr. Mary Zink, Baltimore Humane Society Veterinary Medical Director of the Low Cost Veterinary Wellness Spay/Neuter Center. Hikes take approximately 45min-1h. BYO DOG and proof of rabies vaccination is required The cost is \$2 per dog and no prior registration required. It's a moderate hiking level so dog and hiker need to be able to maneuver trees, hills, and streams. All dogs must be on a 4-6ft leash (no retractable leashes permitted) and walked by a hiker that is 14 years of age or older. Please bring plenty drinking water for yourself and your dog and appropriate hiking attire is recommended (comfortable, flexible, closed-toe shoes and durable clothing that can withstand mud, tall grass, twigs, stickers, stream water etc.) For more info, call 410-833-8848 ext. 219 or visit http://www.bmorehumane.org/
