### Ridgely's Record Parking Petition Coming

Over the past year or so, the Ridgely's Delight Association has been seeking community input regarding the effective hours of parking restrictions. Currently, no permit is required between midnight and 7am on days when there is no stadium event. In a neighborhood survey, the majority of respondents – about 100 people – indicated a preference for a change from the current rules to instead allow for only permit parking (or guest pass) from 6pm-8am.

As a result, the RDA sent a letter to the Parking Authority to consider this change. The next step in the process is to circulate a petition in the neighborhood to verify majority community support. The Parking Authority has advised us that the petition could be ready as soon as the end of September. Every resident of Ridgely's Delight should receive a visit from someone asking whether you want to sign the petition.

*If you <u>support</u> the change* to the parking restriction hours, you should sign the petition.

*If you <u>do not support</u> the change* and want the parking restriction hours to remain the same, do not sign the petition.


Only one person from each household will be counted. All residents, including renters, are eligible to participate in the petition. Per the Parking Authority's rules, only residents may participate. If you own property in the neighborhood but do not live in that property, you are not eligible to sign.

The petition will be circulated over a 120-day period. If one person from each legal household in more than 60 percent of the neighborhood signs the petition, the Parking Authority will continue to the next step and contact all of the petition signers to verify that they have signed. Then the decision process will continue in City government.

The important thing to remember is that you should only sign the petition if you support the change in parking restriction hours. If you do not support it, do not sign the petition. Also, please note that the changes, if approved, will have no effect on parking rules during stadium events.

## Safety Tip: Secure Your Home

Last month, we reminded everyone, new neighbors especially, to leave nothing visible and lock the doors when leaving your car. This month, we'll focus on your home.

When thieves find a home that's easy to break into, they tend to hit other homes in the neighborhood. If they have difficulty breaking in, they tend to move to other areas. That's why it's important for everyone in Ridgely's Delight to make their homes as secure as possible. Following are some tips to help:

- Install a deadbolt lock. Lock your doors every time you leave the house, even if you're going out for just a few minutes during the day.
- Keep garage doors closed and locked.
- Secure sliding doors and windows.
- Don't leave valuables near the windows where they will be visible from outside.
- Mark your property with an engraver to help police in identifying and returning stolen property. Make a property identification list.
- Buy a burglar alarm and test your system monthly.
- Leave a light on a timer. Close bedroom drapes or blinds.
- Keep your front light on at night.
- Work with your neighbors. When you are going to be away, tell trusted neighbors and ask them to watch your property. Have neighbors maintain your yard. When on vacation, have someone cut the grass. Shrubbery should not hide neighbors' view of windows or doors. Have someone pick up newspapers and mail. Tell neighbors to call police if they notice anything suspicious.

If you see something, say something. Call 911 if you see suspicious behavior, like somebody looking in windows or trying to open doors. Join our Nextdoor site at <u>www.nextdoor.com</u> and post a description so neighbors can be on the lookout.

#### Ridgely's Record Why You Need to Scoop the Poop

Think it doesn't matter that you don't clean up after your dog? Aside from being required by law in Baltimore, picking up after your dog's waste is important for your health, the health of your pet and Maryland's environment. Dog waste is an environmental pollutant. Decaying pet waste and sometimes releases consumes oxygen ammonia. Low oxygen levels and ammonia can damage the health of fish and other aquatic life. Pet waste carries bacteria, viruses and parasites that can threaten the health of humans and wildlife. Since storm drains do not always connect to treatment facilities, untreated animal feces often ends up in rivers and streams, causing significant water pollution and in some cases restrictions on fishing and swimming in waterways and beaches. Be sure to carry a biodegradable bag or two when you walk your dog. Throw it in your trash can (not your neighbor's) or empty the bag in your toilet and flush it.
