Special thanks to the Monday citizens on patrol walkers who are not only the eyes and ears for the police, but also pick up trash while they walk. And lastly, thank


you to those who maintain neighborhood planters and small garden areas. We all benefit from a well maintained neighborhood because it shows that we care.
