Among his numerous passions which included gardening, cars and above all a good party, he was an avid runner and ran seventeen Marine Corps marathons among others. Nick was also was involved with many civic organizations as a

lifelong, and proud Democrat, where he worked on numerous political campaigns, including the election of Governor Glendening.

We will miss Nick's electric smile and joie de vivre that he brought to every occasion. His parents and brother's family look forward to being your neighbors. He is also survived by his two dogs – Barney and Emma and his cat, Camden.


