Community & Board Meetings May 1st

First Wednesday, May 1st, this monthly meeting is scheduled for 7 pm at a special location: George Washington Elementary at 800 Scott Street in Pigtown. The theme of the meeting is: "Our Neighborhood's Role in The Success of a Community School". In Ridgely's Delight, if you live, own property or a business, then you are welcome to attend Community meetings and Board meetings. We also welcome our western neighbors from Pigtown and the Southwest Partnership to our meeting.

Guest Speaker: Natasha Guynes is the founder of HER Resiliency Center (HER), an organization dedicated to supporting and guiding vulnerable young women ages 18-25 to becoming self-sufficient, independent adults. A native of Louisiana, Natasha has lived in the Baltimore/Washington area for 18 years. She regularly engages in community opportunities to celebrate and support women's leadership, entrepreneurship and mentorship through public speaking, volunteerism and storytelling performances.

Special Election May 1st

There is a vacancy on the Ridgely's Delight Association Board and the neighborhood bylaws require a special election to fill the open position.

To be eligible to run or vote, community members must attend at least two sanctioned events in the four months prior to the November meeting. These include community and board meetings, clean ups, newsletter delivery, committee meetings, and citizens on patrol walks.
